## **Definitions**

SEND - special educational needs and disabilities

SENCo – special educational needs co-ordinator

Disability – The Equality Act 2010 defines disability as a physical or mental impairment that has a 'substantial' and 'long-term' negative effect on your ability to do normal daily activities

Special Education Need - Children and young people with SEN all have learning difficulties or disabilities that make it harder for them to learn than most children and young people of the same age. These children and young people may need extra or different help from that given to others.

Our Preschool aims to have regard to the SEN codes of practice and DfES codes of practice on the identification and assessment of additional educational needs and to provide a welcome and appropriate learning opportunity for all children.

#### Aims

- To promote the rights of a child with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities to have their needs recognised and met throughout their time at Worstead Preschool and during all transitions.
- To demonstrate how we provide an environment that is accessible to children and parent/carers with disabilities, as far as is possible, in our premises. We aim to recognise each child's individual needs including the identification and assessment process.
- To explain how key persons and the SENCo identify the needs of a child and provide interventions that are additional to, or different from the setting's usual provision and to explain the purpose of the graduated approach system.
- To promote good practice by ensuring confidentiality and privacy for parents/carers and children and respecting the need to seek parental permission when seeking the views of other professionals about their child.
- To explain to parents/carers how to voice concerns they may have about our SEN provision.
- To promote the importance of working together with health professionals, outside agencies and the child's family to support the child.
- We aim to provide universal provision and additional support for children where necessary for progress and development.
- We aim to work on an improvement basis, monitoring our SEND provision regularly to ensure we are up to date with knowledge, training and best practice.

- To promote positive images and role model during play and interaction experiences though out
- To celebrate diversity in all aspects of play and learning.

At Worstead Preschool the staff can provide.

- An assessment of the child's needs based on observation and information from parents/carers, other professionals. This will support an identification and assessment process.
- Information obtained from training that is shared at staff meetings and made available to all members of staff. This information will also be shared with parents / carers when necessary and relevant.
- An environment that promotes development and is inclusive for all children and adults.
   Ensuring our inclusive admissions practice includes equality of access and opportunity.
- Provide families with information and sources of independent advice and support.
- Support and collaborative working with other professionals involved in the child's learning and development.

### Methods

- At Worstead Preschool there are several methods we can use to, identify, assess, support and monitor SEND. We will use any recommended methods we feel confident and competent to undertake.
- Please see below a table of methods regularly used for each area of SEND and universal provision.

# Graduated approach

- At Worstead Preschool we follow the graduated approach, which is an assess, plan, do, review cycle. The graduated approach is used for all areas of SEND and allows us to closely monitor progress keeping support plans up to date. Children's needs may change regularly during their time at preschool which makes the graduated approach great for monitoring and supporting.
- Parents/Carers will be included during each step of the graduated approach and will be encouraged to share information with the settings SENCo or Key Person to support this process.



### Collaborative Working

- At Worstead Preschool we think it is crucial to work collaboratively when supporting children. This includes children with SEND. We pride ourselves on working together with the child's family, early years practitioners in other settings and relevant professionals for example an early year's educational psychologist.
- Worstead Preschool has access to some support lines including Schools and Communities and the SEND inclusion line. These offer us advice and support on how to support your child. Worstead Preschool will seek parent/carer consent before contacting advice lines.
- It is crucial that we keep this communication consistent and we ask that any updates on the child's progress and development is shared with us.
- Worstead Preschool will NOT share information about your child with a professional
   WITHOUT consent. A parent/carer must consent before any information will be shared.

### **Education Health Care Plans**

- In the event of a child needing further support despite the use of a support plan and the graduation approach, it may be time to consider an EHCP (education, health care plan).
- After a conversation with the SENCo and/or Key Person a request can be made to the
  Local Authority to consider an EHCP assessment. This is a detailed evidence-based
  process which used advice and assessments from multiple professionals. The EHCP will
  move with the child throughout their schooling and will be monitored regularly. The plan
  sets out support methods for all areas, education, health and social.
- An ECHP may qualify your child for additional funding.

### Fundina

- All children with SEND may be allocated funding through the Local Authority. The includes SENIF (special educational needs inclusion fund). If your child is receiving additional support at preschool, you may be asked to consent to a SENIF funding application. This application is taken termly and may offer some funding for your child. This funding can be used for staff training, resources and for 1-1 time with an adult for your child to complete activities and tasks that will aid their development.
- Children with an EHCP may be eligible for EHCP funding once the first draft EHCP has been written. This may provide funding for higher staff ratios and possibly a 1-1 to ensure your child is receiving continuous support.
- Children who receive disability living allowance are eligible for DAF (disability access fund)
  which provides the setting with funding to purchase supportive resources for your child and
  relevant staff training.

• All funding will be applied for by Worstead Preschool with parent / carer consent.

## Sensory Room

Worstead Preschool is equipped with a small sensory room. This provides us with an area
to take a small number of children to complete supportive activities. During time in the
sensory room the top barn door will remain open to ensure safeguarding.
